
Abrams Institute for Freedom of Expression Hosts Conference on the Commercial Speech Doctrine

On June 13, Floyd Abrams and other First Amendment experts discussed the commercial speech doctrine, the varying definitions of commercial speech, the historical basis for the commercial speech doctrine, and the likely impact of the Supreme Court's decisions in *Sorrell v. IMS Health, Inc.* and *Reed v. Town of Gilbert* at a special conference hosted by the Abrams Institute for Freedom of Expression. In the opening session, Professor Ron Collins, the Harold S. Shefelman Scholar at the University of Washington School of Law interviewed Judge Alex Kozinski of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in a session entitled "Who's Afraid of Commercial Speech—26 Years Later". Other sessions focused on the commercial speech doctrine's impact on the content creation community, lawyer speech, food and drug and other areas of corporate speech.
